Context for RI and PS partnership

- Regional universities, + research institutes
- Limited experience or incentive to work with PS
- Community
 development focus
 – strong networks,
 trust
- Interest driven by potential for scale, impact, [and funding]



- Micro- and small enterprise 98.3 per cent companies (BPS, 2016)
- Increase product sales / profit









Role of government

- Strong role / involvement of government in Indonesia
- Interventionist policy approach can play out well (maize) or poorly (beef)
- District government as gate keeper and traditional 'scale out' partner for many universities

→ Program philosophy did not encourage formal partnerships with the government as part of ARISA interventions









Partnerships

Sector, Location	Partners	Short description
Beef West Sumbawa and Sumbawa	University of Mataram* PEPEHANI Pt Dharma Raya Hutamajaya	Developing a profitable and sustainable beef production system in Sumbawa. Improving cattle feeding and management practices; linking farmers, traders and processors.
Maize East and North Lombok	University of Mataram* PT Syngenta Indonesia Bank NTB	Promotion of dual cropping of hybrid maize and pulses in drylands. Linking input & credit suppliers, local traders and farmers.
Cassava Jember	University of Jember* PT Bangkit Cassava Mandiri Local enterprise cooperatives	Integrated system for cassava production and processing.
Sugar Madura	Indonesian Sugar Research Institute* Trunujoyo University PTPN X	Development of sugarcane industry on Madura island. Supporting farmers in best practice and market linkages.
Dairy Malang	University of Brawijaya PT Nestle*	Development of fodder farming business model for smallholder dairy production.

Maize & pulse intercropping, East & North Lombok

- **UNRAM**: technical support; agri research; facilitation/brokering between partners, and partners and farmers; community engagement.
- **Syngenta**: technical support and promotion of practices through learning centre; sale of inputs (especially seed).
- Asia Crop Solutions: credit for inputs; purchase of maize harvest at good price
- ARISA: emergency finance to farmers when the original credit provider withdrew from the partnership.
- Bank NTB: KUR loan processing to enable maize input purchases.









Sugar cane production, Madura Island

- **ISRI**: technical support; engagement with community, private and government sectors to champion the sugar industry.
- **PTPN X**: farmer extension/training, credit to farmers for input purchases, purchase and post-harvest transport of cane, land for demonstration plots.
- **PT GMM:** provision of credit to farmers for input purchases, land for demonstration plots, and purchase of harvested cane.









Lessons and insights – partnership

- Significant influence of market & policy changes
- Diverse agendas (research, profit, household benefit)
- Risks of partnership unevenly shared
- Weak institutional incentives for RI participation
- Limited experience / capacity for RI-PS partnership in Indonesia

- Impact / outreach numbers vs. institutional & systemic change










